911 Ordinance needs "clarifying" **County Attorney tells Fiscal Court**

Several options to be presented at next meeting

The Rockcastle County Fiscal Court will consider revamping the section of the 911 ordinance govern-ing term limits of members of the 911 board.

County Attorney Jeff Burdette told the magistrates at their regular the magistrates at their regular thly meeting last Thursday that original ordinance needed "clarimonthly meeting, and the original ordinance needed "clarifying." This ordinance says that two of the 13 seats, the one appointed by the volunteer fire department and the one appointed by the ambulance services are two year terms and, according one appointed by the ambulance service, are two year terms and, according to the ordinance, a member cannot serve two consecutive terms on the board. The question, Burdette said, is whether a member can serve one term representing one department and then be appointed to a term representing in other department. Besides representatives from the

volunteer fire departments and the ambulance service; the 13 member board is made up of two members appointed by the County Judge/Executive and approved by the liscal court, a four year term, one representing the sheriff's department, for the tenure of the appointing sheriff, one representing each of the towns in the county, for the tenure of each of the mayors and one from each magistrail district, for the senure of the appointing magistrate.
