## SBDM elections

All five county schools have set dates for their Site Based Decision Making Councils, (SBDM).

Elections at RCHS were announced last week, which will be held on May 4th for both teachers and parents. The teachers will be elected after school and parents at 6:00 p.m. All nominations have been submitted.

At the Rockcastle County Middle School, parent and teacher nominations will begin on Monday, with the deadline for nominations being on Friday May 7th. The teacher elections will be held directly after school and the parent elections will be held at 6:00 p.m.

At Mt. Vernon Elementary nominations for the two parent positions on the council will be held until May 7th. All nominations have to be submitted in writing, at all schools and to the principals, who are the chairman of the council.

Teacher nominations will be taken until May 6th, the days they will be elected at the school's faculty meeting.

At Roundstone Elementary, nominations for their council members, parents and teachers will be expected until Monday. The elections will be held on May 3rd.

The teacher election will be held directly after school and the parent elections will be held at 6 p.m.

At Brodhead Elementary School parent nominations will be accepted from May 3rd to May 10th. The election will be held on May 17th.

Teacher nominations will be accepted until May 4th and the election will be on May 11th.

All SBDM councils consist of two parent members, three teacher members and the principal.

A parent member cannot be an employee of the school at which they serve or the spouse of a school board member.

Employees of the local school system, who have children at other schools other than where they work, can serve on SBDM councils, according to state law.

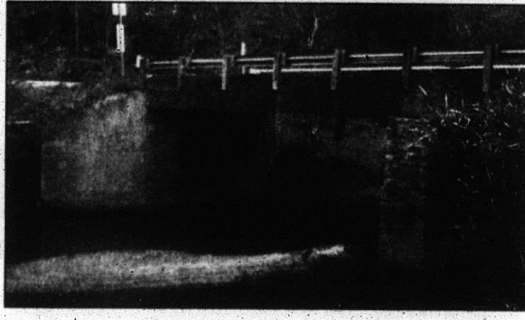

## Cemetery sites chosen for grant applications

Three cemetery sites, with historical significance, in Rockcastle County have been chosen by the Cemetery Board for grant applications to the state. The state has set aside over \$400,000, according to County Judge/Executive Buzz Carlotta, to be given in grant money for the renovation and preservation of cemeteries in the state.

The cemeteries in the county chosen were:

- 1) Chestnut Cemetery. This cemetery is on County Road 1173 (Pleasant Valley Road) and is the burial site of Captain Richard Lewis Myers, who was decorated for "extreme valor" during the Battle of Chickamauga during the Civil War. Myers raised a full company of

- 2) Newcomb Cemetery. This cemetery is located on and originally designated by freed slave Walker Newcomb as a burial site for Rockcastle County's "colored." Located on U.S. 25 (Richmond Street)

All concerned pastors, government and law enforcement officials, community leaders and parents are urged to attend the meeting.

in Mt. Vernon, the cemetery is the burial site of three soldiers in the United States Colored Infantry during the Civil War.

The cemetery's historical significance is that Andrew Russell, Jonathan Smith and Sgt. Samuel Smith, all of the 19th United States Colored Infantry during the Civil War. The United States Colored Troops fought off raids at Big Springs and Ft. Jones on the L&N Railroad; was involved in skirmishes at Glasgow and Taylorville and, additionally, were at the Battle of Wildcat Mountain (Camp Wilcat), which is located within half a mile of Rockcastle County.

## 19 currently pending Sixty-one suits filed to collect delinquent taxes

Delinquent property taxpayers beware!

In a year when budget cuts are slicing through important government services, the payment of property taxes is more important than ever, according to Rockcastle County Attorney Billy Reynolds, whose office handles delinquent property tax collection.

So, Reynolds is presently filing suits in an attempt to collect delinquent property taxes that are still owed for 2003 and preceding years. Since March 4th, 61 suits have been filed in District Court thus far and 19 are pending, Reynolds said. \$349,000 in delinquent taxes are owed the county for just the last four years, according to County Clerk Norma Houk's office.

"The vast majority of Rockcastle County citizens have paid their 2003 property taxes," Reynolds said. "But there are still those who have let their taxes become delinquent."

Property taxes for 2003 are considered delinquent as of January 1, 2004. Once the property tax bill becomes delinquent, the sheriff sends notice before the sale of the tax bill. At that point, the county attorney begins work trying to collect them on behalf of the county and the state. Although collecting five percent or less of the county's property taxes may seem insignificant, county attorneys across Kentucky collect millions of dollars in delinquent property taxes each year.

Last year, former county attorney Jeff Burdette's office collected over \$89,000 on behalf of Rockcastle County. Since 1999, Burdette collected over \$380,000 in delinquent taxes. Remaining delinquent taxes

during that period are still subject to suit.

Reynolds said there is some confusion about the process of collecting delinquent property taxes. "Many people believe we are just waiting for someone to slip up, so we can foreclose on the property," he said. "In truth, we try to avoid foreclosure action. This method is one of last resort."

To collect delinquent taxes, Reynolds said his office sends several written notices to those who have neglected to pay.

If these attempts to collect fail, then a lawsuit to bring a foreclosure action is begun. There is a lien on the property until the tax bill is paid, or the property is sold to pay the delinquent tax bill(s).

Reynolds said the majority of the time this can be avoided and he and his staff work with the taxpayer to get the taxes paid. He emphasized the importance and the serious responsibility to see that taxes are paid.

"There is not a single person in Rockcastle County who does not benefit in some way by county government services, whether it is through attending our public schools, driving on our roads or receiving medical care at our local health department," Reynolds said. "We all use county services, so we all owe taxes. It is only right that everyone pay their fair share."

Delinquent taxes owed for seven years or more cannot legally be collected, although liens still remain on the property. Some of the unpaid tax bills date back to 1982, Mrs. Houk said.

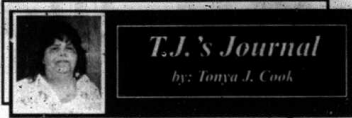

# Take a Walk

Exercise does help. In a decades-long study of Harvard graduates, it has been shown that people who exercise regularly have less obesity, osteoporosis, hypertension, and a lower death rate.

It does not necessarily help to become obsessed with a certain activity for a few months or years, such as running, and then quit, or go skiing a couple of times each winter. To be most useful, exercise does not have to be extremely vigorous, but it must be done on a regular basis. Walking is one of the best exercises for this. Walking has many advantages. It does not require any special equipment other than good shoes, and it does not require any special buildings or fields. It can be done anywhere and can be incorporated into a person's daily activities of getting the mail or going to work. Virtually anyone can do it. Even in the winter it can be good exercise. When it is too cold or icy outside, a person can walk in shopping malls, up and down stairways or do volunteer work in hospitals, nursing homes, or in community projects. Walking can also be a good start program for more vigorous sports such as running, swimming, or tennis.

Injuries are uncommon with walking and the exercise keeps the bones strong by helping prevent the loss of calcium associated with aging. Walking does not burn quite as many calories per mile as running, but it still is an excellent way to help reduce your weight. The weight loss and cardiac benefits can be further increased by vigorous arm swinging or carrying small hand weights.

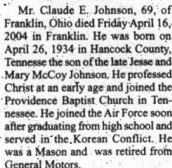

**Avoiding the loss of undermarkings**

Farms with undermarkings will notice the effective undermarkings are equal to 53.59 percent of the farm's prior year undermarkings. In other words according to the MQ-24; Tobacco Quota Notice, the farm lost 43.59 percent of the undermarkings.

According to federal regulations the 2003 tobacco marketing season was from October 1, 2003 and ends September 30, 2004. Therefore, if a producer can grow and have the undermarking tobacco poundage sold by September 30, 2004 (payment received in hand) the farm's 2004 effective undermarking will change.

**Burley Undermarking Factor**  
Notices were mailed on Friday, April 16, 2004.

Farms will be allowed to carry forward undermarkings equal to 53.39 percent of the farm's prior year undermarkings.

The 2004 Burley Tobacco national quota for the quotas has been set at 1,050 (5% rise from 2003 quotas). Leasing began Monday, April 19, 2004 and will end July 1, 2004.

**Sign-up for 2004 DCP**

Warden Alexander, County Executive Director, of Rockcastle County Farm-Service Agency wishes to enroll producers that the enrollment for the 2004 Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) began October 1, 2003 beginning the second year of successful implementation of the 2002 Farm Bill.

Producers must sign DCP contracts annually beginning with the 2003 crop year, which is a change from Production Flexibility Contract requirements under the previous farm legislation.

Producers have until June 1, 2004 to enroll for the 2004 DCP. Producers receive direct payments at rates established by statute regardless of market prices. Counter-cyclical payment rates, on the other hand, vary depending on market prices.

**Map**

Due to new technology FSA is now updating farm producer maps by way of computer. Producers whose farms have been verified are now receiving maps in the mail with acre-

age listed in fields. Acreage listed on the map is what is considered cropland and does not reflect the farm's total acreage. If you no longer own this land please note that FSA cannot change the farm owner until the new owner brings their deed-to-the FSA office.

**Farm Changes**

Producers who have purchased or sold land should inform the FSA office of the change. A copy of the deed or land contract sales is required to update FSA records with correct ownership.

Producers are also reminded to inform the FSA office of any change of address.

**Pesticide Cards**

Producers who plan to purchase restricted-use-chemicals should check the expiration date on their pesticide card. Farmers with expired chemical cards can receive training on restricted use pesticides on Tuesday, April 27th at 7:00 p.m. at the Rockcastle County Extension Office located on West Main Street, Mt. Vernon, Kentucky.



# Lady Rockets take second in two tournament appearances this season

Team has 11-5 record

The Rockcastle County Lady Rockets softball team is off to a fine start this season, under the direction of new Head Coach Jesse Mahaffey and assistants David Riddle and Ken Shay Hopkins.

The Lady Rockets are 11-5 and have placed second in both tournaments they have played in -- both of which were won by the host schools -- Southwestern Pulaski and South Laurel.

The Southwestern Pulaski tournament came down to the Warriors having to beat the Rockets twice for the title and, at South Laurel, the Rockets came in second, losing only to the South Laurel Lady Cardinals. In that tournament, they beat Hazard, Boyle Co. and McCrory Central to edge out Montgomery County for second place.

The teams' five losses have been to Danville, two to Southwestern, one to South Laurel and one to Lincoln. The team, fortunately, has the ser-

vices of an ace pitcher, junior Allison Durham, who transferred in this year from Indiana. Through 14 games, Durham has a 2.45 ERA, has not given up any home runs, has 69 strike-outs and only 18 walks in 71 innings. Durham also sports the best batting percentage at .457, followed by freshman Ainsley Bussell who has a .447 and seventh grader Mary Saylor has a .410.

Against Lincoln, it was a scoreless game, with both pitchers not getting a hit, until the bottom of the fifth when Bussell led off the inning with a bunt single and later scored the first run of the game after Saylor, who had singled up center was caught in a rundown between second and third.

However, Lincoln came back to have a big sixth inning, scoring five runs on five hits and two Rocket errors. They later added a run in the seventh for the final 6 to 1.

In the South Laurel tournament, the Rockets had to play the host team in the first game and it was again a scoreless ballgame through 4 1/2 innings with Durham striking out ten Lady Cardinals through four. The

only hit the Rockets had in the first four was a double by Saylor to lead off the fourth inning.

In the fifth, the Cardinals got six runs on seven hits and two Rockets errors and that was the scoring for the game with the Rockets unable to generate any offense against good Cardinal pitching and defense.

The Rockets overwhelmed their next opponent, Hazard, beating them 15-0 in four innings. Durham gave up only three hits in the game and recorded eight strikeouts. The Rockets had 12 hits, including four doubles, two by Durham and one each for Bussell and Saylor and a triple for Bussell.

It was a much closer third game of the tournament for the Rockets but they prevailed 3-2 over the Boyle County Lady Rebels.

Boyle County drew first blood in the third with the first two batters reaching base on Rocket errors. A

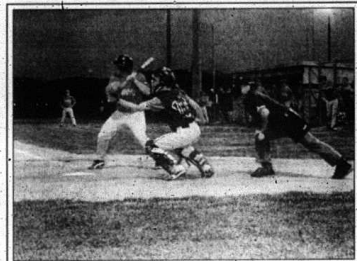

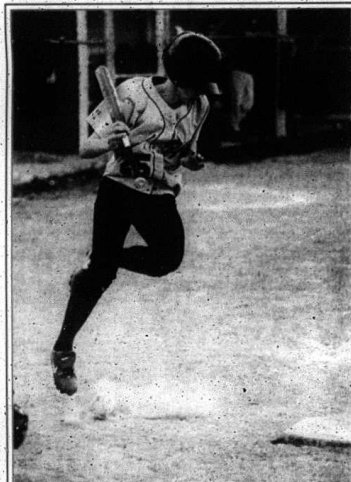

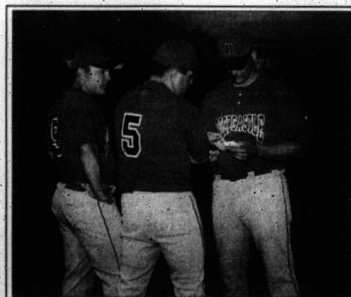

Monday night the Rockets defeated North Laurel in a home game 5-2.

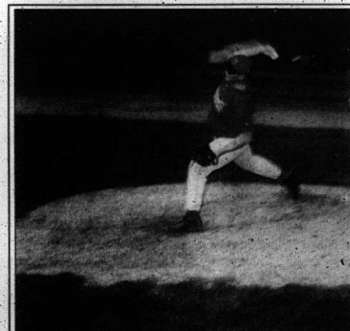
McClure went three innings to pick up his first win of the season against no losses. Hensley added two innings of middle relief and Reams picked up his first save going the last two innings.

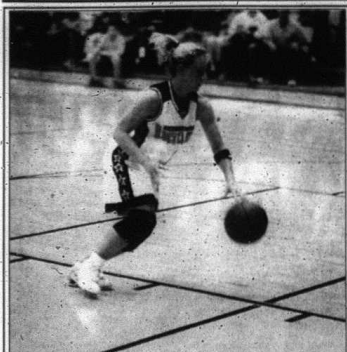
On Saturday the ROCK will face Madison Central and Fleming County. District Tournament play begins on May 24th at the ROCK.

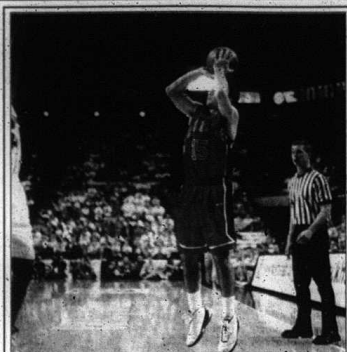

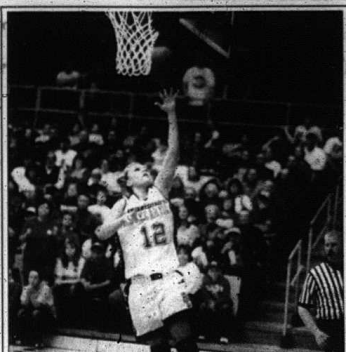

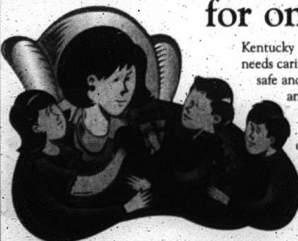

Taking a bat to a mailbox, or hitting it with a brick, or setting off a firecracker or pipe bomb inside may sound like fun to some rambunctious teens. However, it's not a rite of passage, "boys just being boys." It's a criminal act that hurts our neighbors and our community.

Mailboxes are considered federal property, so crimes against them, and the mail they contain are considered a federal offense. Violators can be fined or imprisoned for each act of vandalism.

Damaged mailboxes have to be replaced, costing the owner time, money and inconvenience. Meanwhile, their mail cannot be delivered.

Many people depend on monthly checks and other financial support through the mail, so doing without their mail negatively affects their lives. And some damaged mail cannot be replaced - family photos, letters from sons and daughters serving in the military overseas, and other priceless keepsakes that mean as much to the recipient.

The impact of mailbox vandalism affects all of us. We don't feel as secure in our neighborhoods and communities. Property values can drop as a result of vandalism and other crimes. And prospective new residents may think twice about moving here knowing that our young people

have such callous disregard for the property of others.

If you have teenagers at home, talk with them about the downside of damaging mailboxes and vandalism in general. Remind them of the penalties, the impact on the victims, and that they can get hurt or killed in the process and the Postal Service™ doesn't take such crimes lightly.

"Rusty Wallace's losing streak is over. Wallace took the lead from Jimmie Johnson with 45-laps to go in Sunday's Advance Auto Parts 500 at Martinsville Speedway and held off a hard charge by Bobby Labonte to claim the win, and ending a career-long streak of 105 races without a victory.

"Man, I've got to tell you it's been a long time coming," said Wallace. "We had a good car, got the crew straightened out and man, oh man, what a day this was."

"We are rocking and rolling again. I was coming off that corner and I saw Bobby Labonte closing on me, and I said, man oh man. But I knew he had to catch me before he could pass me."

"We're back on track, and we're going to win this damn championship." Labonte tried desperately to catch Wallace's No. 2 Dodge, but came up short.

"I think we gave it all we had," said Labonte. "I don't think we could

have done any better if we had more laps.

The tempo of the race changed when NASCAR officials red flagged the race during lap 290 after a chunk of the track's surface came loose and slammed into Jeff Gordon's No. 24 Chevrolet, who was leading the race.

After a one-hour and 17-minute delay, racing resumed. Jeff Gordon, who had dominated the race up to that point, pitted for different times under caution for the team to make repairs on his No. 24 Dupont Chevrolet.

The new leaders were Dale Earnhardt Jr., Jamie McMurray, Sterling Marlin and Rusty Wallace when racing resumed on lap 307. Gordon was 21st.

Within 35 laps, Gordon had moved up to 10th, but he was never able to challenge the front runners again and finished sixth.

Dale Earnhardt Jr., Jimmie Johnson and Ryan Newman rounded out the top five.

## Volunteers continue working hard during PRIDE Spring Cleanup

Volunteers have been working hard to clean up Rockcastle County during the last two weeks. Since the PRIDE Spring Cleanup began on April 10, volunteers have picked up 168 bags of trash and four tires in Mt. Vernon and 620 bags of trash and 27 tires along roads in the county. The region-wide cleanup campaign ends Saturday.

"I schedule cleanup events as interested groups contact me," said James Renner, the Rockcastle County Solid Waste Coordinator, who also volunteers as the county's PRIDE Coordinator. Renner makes sure road signs are posted where volunteers are working and provides them with the cleanup supplies.

By April 17, six roadside clean-

ups had been completed by volunteer groups from the Rockcastle Hospital, Conway Baptist Church, Jackson Energy Cooperative and the Hammond Fork Community and one volunteer in the Carter Ridge Community. Four more groups were scheduled to work this week and weekend. New Hope Baptist Church, the Senior Citizens Center, the Appalachian Service Center and Poplar Grove Baptist Church.

"If anyone wants to volunteer to cleanup in their community this weekend, they can call me at 256-1902," Renner said. "There isn't much time left, but I will try to accommodate as many requests as possible."

Within Mt. Vernon, approxi-

mately 30 volunteers have participated in cleanup events organized by the city, according to Mayor Clarice R. Kirby. "I hope even more volunteers get involved to finish up this weekend because there are a few areas left to clean. Several people have called to register already."

The city is sponsoring the last cleanup on Saturday. Volunteers will meet at 9:00 a.m. at the Lake Linville boat dock. Volunteers can register on site, but they are encouraged to register before Saturday to ensure enough cleanup supplies are available. Registration forms are available at city hall and the boat dock.

"We still need pontoons and other boats to clean the lake and the shoreline," said Mayor Kirby. Interested boat owners should talk to the boat dock operator.

To celebrate a successful Spring Cleanup, the city will host a cookout for volunteers at 3:00 p.m. on Saturday at the Lake Linville boat dock. At 4:00, cash prizes will be awarded to the volunteers that filled the most trash bags and to the groups with the most volunteers. Also, volunteers will redeem certificates for prizes. The certificates are hidden in trash around the city for volunteers to find as they clean up. The prizes that are not redeemed with certificates will be awarded by drawing names from all volunteers who have registered to participate in the cleanup.

The PRIDE Spring Cleanup is a two-week campaign to clean the hillsides, roadsides and waterways in the 38 counties of southern and eastern Kentucky. PRIDE provided the county and city with trash bags, gloves and safety vests for volunteers to clean up around the community.

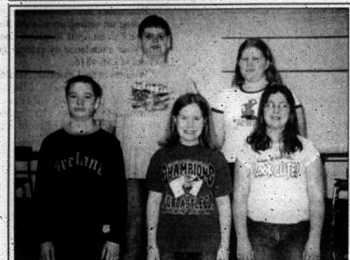
