## Court passes 04-05 budget; adopts new 911 ordinance

The Rockcastle Fiscal Court gave final approval last Wednesday to their 2004-05 \$4,140,054 budget.

The budget reflices estimated recipits in the general fund of \$11,188,848; \$881,400 in the road fund and \$732,765 in the Jail Fund. During the meeting, Jailer James Miller told the court that he was now getting to keep more state prisoners which would microse the jail's revenuently over last dar. The jail is cut with the properties of the part of the most prisoners. Another bit of good news for the county came after the meeting, when the general fund received over 250,000 which is an unusual occurrence for the last-day of the fiscal year.
