Board approves additional raise for school employees

The Rockcastle County Board of Education approved another half percent raise for school employees during their regular monthly on Thesday night.

The board had already approved a one and half percent raise, which was mandated by Kentucky Governon Emis Pletcher, and is required to be paid from local funds. The cost to the local board will be \$200,000. The other half percent will come.

\$200,000.

The other half percent will come, from the state, at a cost to them of \$56,000.

The pay increase will go into effect this month.

It is the smallest raise foreschool employees in recent years. But school financie officer Richard Bray pointed out that employees had re-ceived a 60 percent raise over the

ceived a 60 percent past 14 years. The state's budget is currently directly under the control of Gov. Fletcher, because the Democrats and Republicans cannot reach an agree-

ment on a state budget.

The board also rejecting bids on three building projects and gave Superintendent-Hammond and Bray authorization to negotiate the building projects' cost directly with rehitect Garland Vanhook.

Vanhook, formerly of Rockastle County, is the architect on all three projects.


The projects are additional bleachers at the Rockastle County Middle School, a room in the former county bus garage, across the street from the central office, for training of teachers and a batting and pitch-

One I-75 crash leads

Last Thurnday, Kenpicky Vehicle
Enforcemeint Officer Ivan Reed was
investigating a single vehicle crash
on 1-75 in Rockeastle County, ap-proximately 4 miles north of Mr.
Vernon, when another wreck hap-pened at the site.
A tractor trailer driven by Jeff
Marcum, 28, of Matochester, crested
the hill the Ander Belder State.

A tractor trailer driven by Jeff Marcum, 28, of Manchester, crested the hill near the Brindle Ridge over-pass and observed two vehicles stopped in the left. lane traveling north, according to Kentucky State Police Public Affairs Officer Craig

Sutton.

Battering means living in constant fear. Keeping the body and mind in a state of constant arousal has a negative physical effect. Fear was meant to be a short term emotion to help humans tope with a threat. It was not meant to go on for months and years. Children who grow up in violence are always looking over their shoulders, wondering when the next battle will occur.

They know it is coming: they just

Violence makes children feel
powerless. They want to help Mom

being abusive. Many children, some
as young as three or four, will try to

"There were no allegations of abuse or neglect," Schultz said. "She used foster care for punishment. it's supposed to be used to protect chil-

her case. "She knew the screwed up." Schultz said.

"I have followed the rule of law and treated every party with utmost dignity and respect," Earnbert countered. "It is not my nature to be abosive or dismissive with anyone. The behaviors of these women are orchestrated to attempt to intimidate me and to prevent me from doing my job as a family court judge."

Derek Morrow, Sandy Morrow's husband, said the Judicial Conduct Commission would not take any action against Lambert because of who her husband is. "(Joseph Lambert) appoints those people," Derek Moreow aid. "Day out think they! Il take any action? No."

While the amit-Lambert faction is clamoring to be heard, there are also people who say they appreciate befamily court judge.

"My son and I might not be alive today if it were not for Judge Lambert," said Lori Dayson Bowles of Liberty in a recent letter to the editor printed in the Danville Advocate-Messenger. "I am a survivor of domestic violence. I could not see at the time that I was being abused until I was ordered by the court to get the help that I needed and the time away from the abuser to see clearly that my child and I were in danger. I think it is a shame what these people are tryis a shame what these people are try-ing to do to Judge Lambert. She showed nothing but compassion and

care in our case."
"I am so very grateful for what she did for me, for if it were not for her I would not be where I am today, and that is very safe and happy, living free with my 14-year-old son," said Bowles.

Lambert said yesterday she con-idered some of the remarks made by er detractors as "very libelous and ctionable."







Every water complany is dedicated to ensuring the quality of water that we provide to you and your family.

The Brodhead Water Works purchases water from the City of Mt. Vernon Water Works, which is treated surface water from Lake Linville, located at Renfro Valley. Mt Vernon Water Works and Brodhead Water Works routinely monitors for contaminants in your drinking water according to State and Federal laws. The table enclosed shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st through December 31, 2003

Sources of drinking water (both tap and bottles water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animal or human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include microbial contaminants, inorganic contaminants, pesticides and herbicides, organic chemical contaminants, and radioactive contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems.

The final source water assessment plan has not been completed, but, is scheduled to be completed by May 2003. A summary of the system's susceptibility to potential sources of contaminants will be included in the plan and will be available for inspection at City Hall and the Cumberland Valley Area Office in London, Kentucky.
