Bomb threat at Rockcastle Hospital

A bomb threat was received at the Rockcastle Hospital on Sunday night, but obviously panned out to be nothing.

Mikhail Shaffer, Director of Public Relations for the local hospital, said in a released statement on Wednesday that the hospital was locked down for about one hour while emergency responders and members of the hospital staff searched the facility.

"It was just a sick hoax, but we always deal with these things very seriously," he said.

Somerset lawyer files for judgeship

Somerset attorney Bruce W. Singleton announced Wednesday that he has filed with the Secretary of State as a candidate for District Judge. He is seeking to fill the unexpired term of Walter F. Maguire who retired effective June 30th.

Singleton, 52, has practiced law in Somerset for over 26 years. He was born in Danville and grew up in Lexington where he attended the University of Kentucky.

Singleton files for District Judge

General Election Nov. 2nd

The General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 2nd and will, of course include, the race for President of the United States, which will be between Democrat United States Senator John Kerry and incumbent Republican George W. Bush.

Powerful U.S. Representative Harold Rogers, of Somerset, is unopposed for his 11th term in the House in the fifth district and Democratic State Senator Daniel Mongiardo, of Hazard, will try to best incumbent Republican Jim Bunning of Northern Kentucky in the U.S. Senate race.

Bunning has nearly \$4 million in his re-election fund and is heavily favored. Bunning has not appeared in Rockcastle County since his election to the U.S. Senate several years ago.

Mongiardo also has not yet campaigned in the county.

Locally, there will be races for all three city councils, (Mt. Vernon, Broadhead and Livingston) and there will be races in school board divisions two, four and five.

Incumbent board member

Martin Vanzant has already filed in division four and Board Chairman Terry Burton has filed for re-election, in division-two. Incumbent board member Mike Burdette has not filed in division five, but has indicated he will.

In the city council races, only two have filed. Incumbent Wayne Bullock and former council member Jackie Renner have filed in Mt. Vernon.

County Attorney Billy Reynolds, who was appointed to fill the unexpired term of former Rockcastle County Attorney Jeffrey T. Burdette also filed. He is presently unopposed.

His predecessor was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Circuit Judge Dan Venters and will face Somerset attorney Scott Lawless in the General Election.

Whoever wins will serve until 2006 when all district, Circuit and county races will be held. Burdette was Rockcastle County Attorney for ten years and was unopposed in the last two

elections. Only one person, Roy Reynolds, has filed for one of the seats on the Rockcastle County Soil Conservation Board. Reynolds is a Ag teacher at Rockcastle County High School.

Somerset Attorney Bruce W. Singleton has filed for the district judge's seat, left vacant, because of the retirement of long-time District Judge Walter Maguire, also from Somerset. No one else had filed in that race as of Wednesday.

The filing deadline for the November Election is Tuesday. Those wishing to change their voter registration have until October 5th.

Those wishing to file and/or change their voter registration must do so in County Clerk Norma Houk's office, which is located on the second floor of the Rockcastle County Courthouse. For more information contact Houk's office at (606) 256-2831.

Deputy Sheriff William Mink hurt in Friday wreck on 461

Rockcastle County Deputy Sheriff, and former Mt. Vernon Police Chief, Bill Mink was injured on Friday in a two vehicle accident on Hwy. 461.

The accident occurred at approximately 11:05 a.m.

Kentucky State Police Trooper Staci Walker responded to the scene of the crash, approximately four miles south of Mt. Vernon.

According to the report, Mink, 63, of Mt. Vernon was traveling southbound in his cruiser, when he observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed in the northbound direction.

Deputy Mink, activated his emergency equipment and was turning his vehicle around when he was struck in the driver's side by a 2002 Dodge Caravan, also traveling south and behind Mink. The van was driven by

Russell O'Hara, 34, of Independence. O'Hara said Mink pulled in front of him, after allowing another vehicle to pass.

Mink was airlifted to the UK Medical Center in Lexington where he was treated for broken ribs, a broken collar bone and multiple fractures. He was released from the hospital on Tuesday.

The O'Haras family was transported to the Rockcastle Hospital where they were treated for minor injuries and released.

Trooper Walker is conducting the investigation and was assisted at the scene by Trooper Ryan Loudermilk, Detective Gary Lane and the Rockcastle County Sheriff's Department.

Traffic was block both ways on Hwy. 461 for at least an hour.

Burton to represent Kentucky as page at national convention

In less than a month, the Republican National Convention will take place in New York City. The event is sure to be one of excitement for Republicans across the nation as they will hear from many leaders of their party ranging from the Governor of California to President George W. Bush.

Travis Taylor Burton, son of Regina T. Burton of Quail, will attend the convention and represent the Commonwealth of Kentucky as a Youth Page. Burton is a 2003 graduate of Rockcastle County High School and is currently attending Georgetown College.

Only three youths in every state were chosen to participate in the program. Burton had to submit a resume and be interviewed by the then State Republican Party Chair, Ellen Williams to earn his spot at the convention.

"I am very honored to have been selected to take part in this once-in-

lifetime opportunity," Burton said. Duties for the 150 youth pages will include distributing materials to the delegates prior to all Convention sessions, assisting the delegates during the sessions and, participating in rallies on the Convention floor. There is also an exclusive lecture series planned for the pages that will include many Republican VIPs.

Burton currently serves as the county's Young Republican Chairman. He is also a Republican precinct captain for the Brown precinct. At Georgetown, Burton is in the middle of his term as Student Government's secretary and was recently elected a vice-president of the Georgetown College Republicans. In his fraternity, Pi Kappa Alpha, Burton is in charge of public relations.

In 2003, Burton attended the Youth Conference on National Affairs, and was honored as an "Outstanding Statesman." He also served as the county's Youth Chair for the Fletcher-Pence Campaign. Burton spent two summers working for former County Attorney, Jeffrey T. Burdette.

"The Rockcastle County Republican Party is very proud of Travis," said local Republican Chairman John Ford. "He has displayed excellent leadership and organizational skills throughout the past few years, while he has been very active in local campaigns," Ford continued. The local club has contributed in part to fund Burton's trip to the convention.

The Convention is set to begin August 30 and run until September 2. Burton will "report for duty" on August 28.

marriage and puts monetary well-being above everything else.

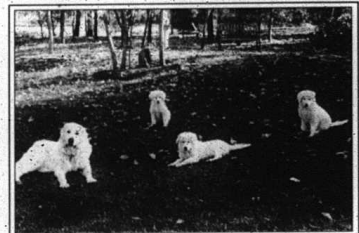
We must work toward being a nation that honors God and treasures the values upon which this nation was founded.

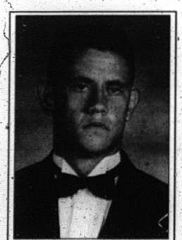

After a one-year stint in the Missouri Valley Conference, WKU men's team will join the women's team and compete for a Sun Belt Conference title in February 2005. Coach Bill Powell, now the second winningest coach in NCAA, will begin his 35th year as head coach.

School Has Started. Watch Out For Our Children.

BE ALERT TO VISUAL CUES:

Watch for school zone signs, cross walks, school crossing guards, buses, and kids walking along the roadway. Around parked cars, watch for shadows and motion-signs that a child may be present.

SLOW DOWN: At only 20 mph, a car travels 41 feet between the time you see a child and actually stop. If you're sleepy or distracted, reaction time and stopping distances increase. Worn tires and wet pavement have a similar effect.

ALLOW YOURSELF TIME TO REACT: On two-lane streets, move as close to the center line as possible, allowing room for bicyclists and pedestrians. As mornings become darker this fall, drive with your headlights on so that you can see and also be seen.

USE YOUR HORN JUDICIOUSLY: A light touch is all that's really necessary, whereas a blast might scare a child.

USE CAUTION AROUND BUSES: Motorists are required to stop for loading/unloading buses and remain stopped as long as the bus has its red lights flashing and stop sign extended. However, drivers on multi-lane highways (more than 4 lanes) need not stop for loading/unloading school buses traveling in the **OPPOSITE** direction. Keep in mind that buses require extra room for turning at intersections.

BE PATIENT, PARTICULARLY ON THE WAY HOME: Risk of accidents is **FOUR** times greater in the afternoon - due to human psychology. Drivers are less alert and are irritable after a long day at the office. Kids, however, are excited to be out of school. As frustrating as it may be, keep your temper. Being two minutes late for dinner won't kill you or anyone else. Rushing just might.

It was another great week for Christ's Outreach for the Blind. Rich Pond Baptist Church, of Bowling Green, Ky, brought a group of dedicated workers to the Outreach.

The team worked tirelessly throughout the week. They cleared trails, wired appliances, completed the blower for ductwork and much more. The upkeep on a facility of this size can sometimes be overwhelming. Even cutting the grass takes four people per week and once finished, someone else must begin mowing again. Andrea White, 13, felt God with the group all week. "He touched every Christian here and he's working through all of us telling us to keep going each day, we can do it and finish His work for Christ's Outreach."

Tracy Woods was the coordinator and group leader for Rich Pond. She was able to organize and keep everyone on task. Though she has done wonderful work herself, Tracy Woods was quoted as saying that she felt "that although Mike has no sight, he has better vision than I do."

Much of the work was often made more difficult due to large amounts of rainfall. When it rains here in here, the mud seems to get everywhere. One young man got stuck in the mud and the group had the diffi-

cult task of freeing him - and he was walking freshly cleared trails!

We would like to thank this opportunity to thank Freedom Baptist and Charlotte Holcomb, a leader of the WMU, for attending a site visit at Christ's Outreach on Saturday, July 10. This is one more church that wants to become involved with what God is doing here in Mt. Vernon, Kentucky.

Christ's Outreach for the Blind will be erecting a barn for 20 horses, which will be approximately 18,000 sq. ft., and an 80-acre corral. This corral will take 3200 oak planks to make. We are using these planks as a means to finish this camp.
