



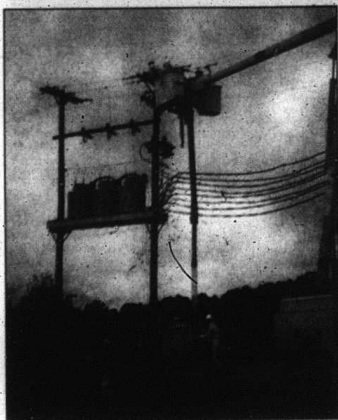

## Bomb threat at RCHS Monday

The Rockcastle-County High School was evacuated about 11:15 a.m. Monday after the school received a bomb threat at around 4

o'clock in the morning. According to Rockcastle County Emergency Management Director Hal Holbrook, the first call came into the Kentucky State Police Post at

3:40 a.m. and the second call was received at 5:48 a.m. Both calls promised a bomb would go off at noon.

Holbrook, law enforcement officials, members of the Mt. Vernon Fire and Rescue and school officials were at the high school in only a few minutes. The school was searched and no bomb was found.

Holbrook and law enforcement officials were asked to leave by Principal John Hale at the start of school because of all the questions being asked by students, Holbrook said. Everyone asked to leave, left, and after school began a K-9 unit was brought in to search the school again.

Students were taken to the parking lot and the practice football field for approximately one hour and fifteen minutes.

Rockcastle County Superintendent Larry Hammond, who was at the school earlier in the morning and at the time the bomb was supposed to go off, said the call came through a cell phone tower in Brodhead.

"We would not have had school if we had thought there was any student in danger," Hammond said. "I would not be here if I thought there was a bomb in the school," Hale said.

## Fiscal Court raises employee health insurance coverage

Bucking the trend of government and health insurance coverage for employees, the Rockcastle County Fiscal Court voted Tuesday, at their regular meeting, to up employees' coverage and to absorb the additional \$10.35 per month premium increase.

The court went with the same company, CHA, but chose CHA 13 as the plan that would be used for the 37-39 employees covered under their group plan. Under the old plan, an individual had to meet a \$500 deductible for office visits, in-patient and out-patient services, diagnostic testing and emergency room visits and then pay 25% of the charge. Under the new plan, the deductible does not apply to office visits or diagnostic testing, only a \$20 co-pay will be made at the time of the treatment.

The renewal premium under the old plan would have been \$202.47 per month for employee, of which the county pays \$125 per employee. Under the new plan, the premium will be \$213.82 per month and the county (Cont. to A-11)

## Break-ins

3th District Constable David Mason reported a rash of break-ins and home invasions on the Jack Hunt Road at Pine Hill on Sunday night within about a two hour period.

Mason said the home of William and Joleen Moss was broken into and between \$6,000 and \$8,000 taken in guitars, jewelry, old money, guns. Entry was gained through a back window. The Mosses were not at home at the time.

The phone lines were cut at the home of Mrs. Moss's mother, Maybelle Moore but Mrs. Moore, who is on crutches, managed to run off the invaders. She also "ran them off" as they attempted to break into the home of James Jones, according to Mason.

The home of Minnie Kirby was broken into also while Mrs. Kirby was at church. Entry to Mrs. Kirby's home was gained by kicking in a back door. Nothing was taken in that break-in.

Mason and the Rockcastle County Sheriff's Department are investigating the incidents and Mason said there are suspects and he expects arrests to be made soon.

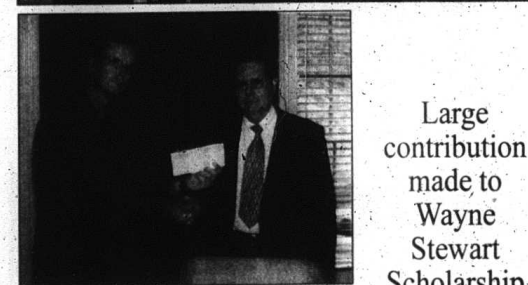


## Bradley hurt

Chris Bradley, 26, of Quail, was seriously injured Friday afternoon, when a bucket from a back-hoe released while he was washing it, crashing him.

A family friend found Bradley and reported the accident to authorities around 5 p.m.. He was taken to the Rockcastle County County Hospital and later flown to the University of Kentucky where he was put on a ventilator. Bradley was working on a dairy farm owned by Raymond Brown when the accident occurred.

Bradley, who reportedly suffered extreme internal injuries, was released from UK on Wednesday. Doctors have told family members it will be a long recovery for him.

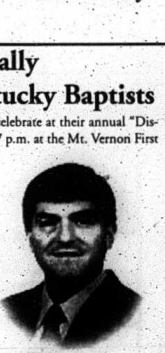

For an eligible family of 62 years of age or older, that cannot afford to repay a loan, grant funds are available to remove health and safety hazards from their home.

USDA Rural Development also provides low interest loans to families with low incomes to purchase a home. Financing is available for 100% of the appraisal price. Closing costs can be included in the loan.

### Building Blocks for a Healthy Future

One of the best foundations that parents can lay for their children's future is healthy habits. Encouraging healthy habits during childhood is a key building block for growing into a healthy adult.

Recently, The Wall Street Journal reported new research showing that the warning signs of heart attacks and strokes that kill adults can be tracked in children as young as 2 years old. Heart disease is the number one killer of American adults. The behavioral risk factors associated with heart disease can also be linked to other diseases, such as diabetes and some types of cancer. These risk factors include obesity, poor nutrition, lack of physical activity, and cigarette smoke.

### Childhood Overweight

Overweight among American children has tripled in the last 15 years. About 25% of all children in the United States between the ages of 6 and 17 are overweight. Overweight children are more likely to be obese adults. Promoting a healthy weight during childhood may help reduce the risk of heart disease and other diseases as an adult. Overweight in childhood is also linked to an alarming upward trend in the number of overweight teens and young adults with Type 2 diabetes. If you think that your child

may be overweight, talk to his/her doctor.

**Physical Activity and Children**  
According to results of a survey of physical activity trends released by the Center for Disease Control, Kentucky is ranked the least active state in the nation. Watching television, playing computer or video games and talking on the telephone are examples of time spent being physically inactive. Physical inactivity is a major risk factor for developing heart disease and related risk factors, such as obesity, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, and diabetes. Being physically active also helps to build strong bones and muscles.

Preschoolers should be active for at least 60 minutes and up to several hours each day. It doesn't have to be all at once, and it doesn't have to be through organized sports. Physical activity should be fun. Find an activity that your child likes to do and encourage him/her to do it often. Teach your family healthy eating habits. Set a good example by modeling healthy eating and participating in physical activities.

On Wednesday, September 15 and Friday, September 17 the Roundstone Elementary School music program hosted a school wide music residency.

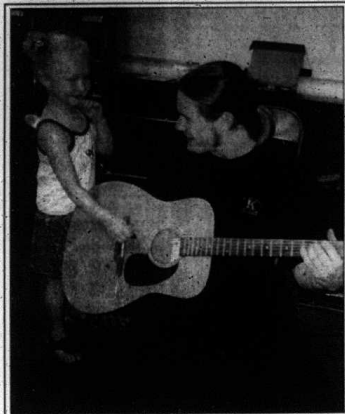
Chris Mullins, Resident Musician for the Kentucky Music Hall of Fame and Museum was the guest musician for the residency.

Over the course of two days, Mullins performed on the acoustic guitar, the bass guitar and the mandolin displaying various music skills and styles, which included bluesgrass, country, rock, and several classical pieces by Bach. In addition to the skills and styles, Mullins quizzed the students on the similarities and differences of the three instruments.

Mullins encouraged the students to become musicians by stating, "I've been playing the guitar since I was about your age but only just recently learned how to play the mandolin. So, you can see that you're never too young or too old to begin playing a

musical instrument." As bass guitarist for the metal group Unweathered Winter Mullins composes much of the group's original musical numbers several of which he performed for the students. According to Roundstone music instructor Sandy Allen, "Chris connected with the students immediately. From the pre-schoolers all the way to the fifth graders and teachers, he was able to sense what was going to work for each grade level. His ability to play bluesgrass one minute or a rock piece and then shift to a classical piece kept the students focused on the distinctive characteristics of each type of music and the individual instruments."

The Rockcastle Co. 4H Poster Contest is getting up in each of our county's elementary schools. Each year the students are given an opportunity to demonstrate their creativity by competing in the contest. The following rules must be met in order to qualify.

1. Poster must be created by a currently enrolled 4H'er.
2. Well known cartoon figures cannot be used because they are copyrighted. (Examples: Looney Tunes, Sponge Bob-Square Pants, Blues Clues, Mickey Mouse, Star Wars, Spiderman, Charlie Brown, Pooh, etc.)
3. All posters must be designed on, or affixed to, 016 ply construction paper; poster board (solid fiber board) of 14 inch x 22 inch dimensions (one-half a standard poster board size). They may be horizontal or vertical. Posters may be produced by any medium, such as, watercolor, ink, crayon, acrylic,

charcoal, oils, or collage, as long as they are not three dimensional.

4. 4H is to be the topic for the poster. You can show what you think 4H is, what you do in 4H, or what you think 4H does for young people.
5. The 4H'er's name, age, FULL MAILING ADDRESS, county, teacher, school and grade must be affixed to the back of the poster board in the upper left hand corner.
6. Winners will be chosen by grade 4,5,6,7, & 8.

Posters are due on October 15, 2004. The first and second place winners will receive a plaque. Third place winners will receive blue ribbons.

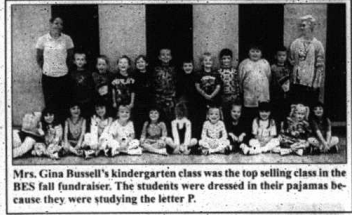

They were also told that there were samples now being collected to gauge the level of contamination in creeks in the county.

The establishment of a county-wide planning commission was suggested to deal with the county's sewer problems.

The court also approved a claim from Rockcastle County Corner Bill Dowell for \$500.90 for transportation expense; tabled a request for in-kind match from the Daniel Boone Development Council for trenching on Slusher Hollow Road for water line until the area can be inspected; adopted an ordinance relating to electioneering within 300 feet of a polling place; approved a donation of \$150 to the Little League baseball program; accepted the Sheriff's Settlement for 2003 tax collection and issued a Quetnas and appointed Ann Gregory Taylor to the 911 board as a replacement for Richard Dean, originally appointed as the Magistrate's selection.

I could have easily gotten by her, but I stood out of respect for the situation; I stopped. When the security guard got into my vehicle she radioed the Principal, who told me later that if I had called, he would have talked to me, but I still would not have been allowed into the high school complex.

Most of the people who know me, know I was only doing my job. My car is not like hundreds of cars did not pass the high school on the by-pass and wonder what was going on. I managed to climb a fence and snap a picture of students on the football practice field. It wasn't a "dignified" approach but I was mainly questioning the school's position that they had the authority to keep me off public grounds.

The part of the media being banned does not bother me, because, I got in anyway. Their argument would be that all students were safe. Thank you for that. It could have been a little too late and what is one day of school missed. Winter comes every year.

Again people who know me, know I don't care to voice my opinion, which is sometimes wrong, but

Governor Ernie Fletcher's proposal on health insurance is a joke.

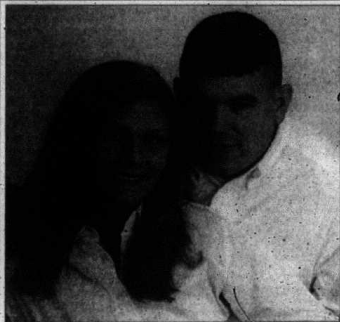

## Giving all to do God's Work

Teen Mission, USA scheduled a mission trip to Christ's Outreach for the Blind for July 25th through July 31st. This was a combination of two churches, Freetown Church of Christ of Freetown, Indiana and Cornerstone Church of Christ of Chatham, Virginia.

"Bill Teegarden, pastor of Freetown Church of Christ and the leader of the groups, is a great role model. Bill was so excited, the group hadn't been here thirty minutes when Bill took me aside and told me that their Sunday school class of young children had pooled their money to make a donation to Christ's Outreach for the Blind. With tears in his eyes, Bill told me about a young boy who hardly had any money. This boy brought in a coffee can full of pennies and nickels. Bill said that they were actually cleaning coffee grounds off the change as they were counting it, but he didn't want to take

it because he knew that this was all the child had. The children challenged the church to match their donation. The children raised \$1,061.83. This was the hardest donation that we have ever accepted, but probably the most blessed," Mike Gates grinned. "Monday arrived and these groups were ready to go to work. It was an awesome day. However, Tuesday was a nightmare." Late Tuesday afternoon, a falling tree struck Josh Teegarden, 23, in the head, killing him instantly. Josh was preparing to go to seminary to attain his master's in English, so that he could begin full-time mission work. This was a young man committed to doing God's work.

"This is one of those times when God doesn't make sense to me," Gates commented. "I feel like I am in the center of God's will, doing what God would have me do. Josh was in the center of God's will, do-

ing what God would have him doing. Bill and Pam Teegarden, Josh's parents, are also in the center of God's will, doing what God would have them doing. I just don't understand why this happened."

The most remarkable thing of all is that Bill and Pam were the ones that helped Mike and Lori Gates through this difficult time. "It should have been the other way around," Mike said. "I stood down at the barn sobbing. Bill told me that I couldn't let this get to me and that I can't quit."

Within one hour of his son's death, Bill inquired about the group returning to finish their mission trip. Bill and Pam, their two daughters and sons-in-law, and many others from Freetown, are scheduled to return to Christ's Outreach on September 17, 2004. To show their support for the family and the church, many members of Cornerstone Church of Christ will also join the Teegardens on their return.

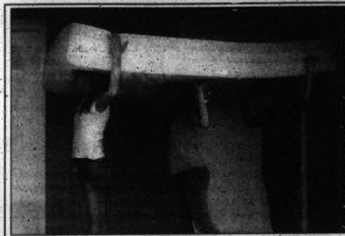

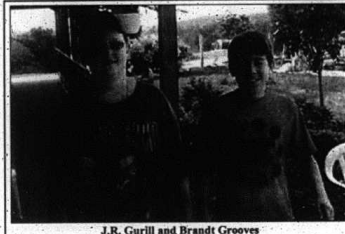

## Agricultural News

### Disaster Declaration

On June 21, 2004, President Bush declared 67 Kentucky counties as disaster areas due to damages and losses caused by severe storms, flooding, tornadoes and mudslides that occurred from May 26, 2004 and continuing. Rockcastle County is included in these 67 counties.

The counties named as disaster counties are eligible for Federal disaster assistance, including FSA Emergency loans for eligible family farmers.

FSA will make loans, up to \$500,000 per borrower, at a statutory 3.75% interest rate, subject to a test for credit. Applications must be filed with the local FSA County office not later than February 10, 2005 for physical and production losses.

### Warehouse Designation

As a condition of price support of burley tobacco producers are required to inform FSA of the warehouse where they will market tobacco. This is required by completing the form FSA-808, Warehouse Designation, to indicate where the tobacco will be sold.

The regular re-designation schedule is as follows:

September 24, 2004 through October 1, 2004

November 1, 2004 through November 5, 2004

November 29, 2004 through December 3, 2004

January 3, 2005 through January 7, 2005

January 31, 2005 through February 4, 2005

During re-designation periods

marketing cards will be effective 10 days after the re-designation period ends.

The warehouse number will be indicated with a number on the marketing card and if a producer decides to market at a warehouse other than the one specified on the card, the producer must return the card to the FSA office in a specific time period to request another marketing card.

### Conservation Reserve Program

General sign-up for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) began Aug. 30 and will run through Sept. 24, 2004. CRP is the country's largest conservation program on private lands with 329,929 acres in Kentucky under contract.

CRP protects fragile cropland from erosion and improves the nation's natural resources. By reducing water runoff and sedimentation, the program safeguards surface water and helps improve the condition of lakes, rivers, ponds and streams. Acreage enrolled in CRP is devoted to resource-conserving vegetative covers, making the program a major contributor to more abundant wildlife populations.

CRP participants voluntarily remove environmentally sensitive land from agricultural production by enrolling in long-term contracts for 10 to 15 years. In exchange, participants receive annual rental payments and a payment of up to 50 percent of the cost of establishing conservation practices.
