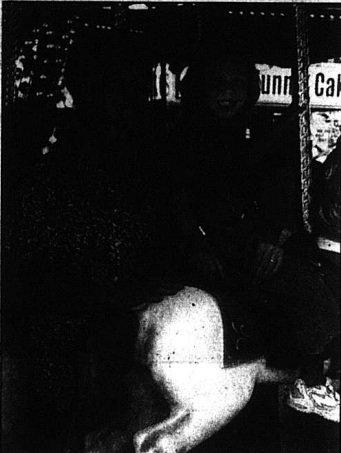

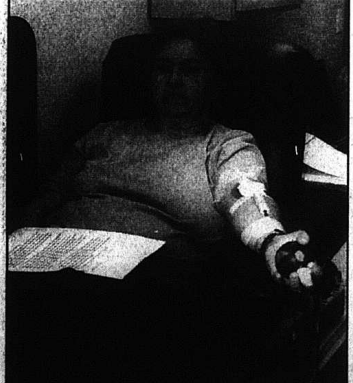

## 100 percent of set goals met FEDS say Rockcastle Schools meet standards

All of Rockcastle County's five schools made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), the federal standards under the "No Child Left Behind" (NCLB) act as measured through the state tests in reading and math. Each school and district has a specific number of NCLB goals to meet in order to meet this standard. Rockcastle County Schools and the district as a whole met 100% of their goals.  
This is an accomplishment that was reached by only 76 of the 176 school districts in the state of Kentucky.  
Those results were released last week by the Kentucky Department of Education, which uses the scores from last year's CATS test.  
If any Rockcastle County school that receives federal funding or the district had not met the NCLB goals for two consecutive years they would be subject to federal consequences. (See information on NCLB Consequences on A10).

"We are pleased with the efforts of everyone," said Superintendent Larry Hammond.  
"All of our employees work hard to give our students a very well rounded education and we have no intentions of letting up, Hammond said.  
District wide the test results of 1,323 fourth, fifth, seventh, eighth, tenth and eleventh grade students showed improvement at every school, however, the Rockcastle Middle School was the only county school to improve their scores in both reading and math.  
488 seventh and eighth graders were tested at the middle school where students scored almost ten percent higher in both math and reading.  
The best score at the middle school was in reading, where over 72 percent of those tested were reading on grade level, or proficient.  
But, the ten percent increase of students scoring proficient in math still only resulted in 34.5 percent

meeting the standard.  
"Obviously that is an area we really need to work on, said third year principal Jason Cogner.  
Cogner had great praise for his school's efforts.  
"We have a great staff, both certified and classified, who bear the responsibility for the learning that occurs in their classroom and our school. I have always known that we have outstanding individuals working in our school, who strive to meet all students' needs and the NCLB data validates that point. We also appreciate our student body for their efforts and for making our jobs so enjoyable," Cogner said.  
Brodhead Elementary also should stick a feather in their cap.  
The school had 100 percent proficiency in reading.  
All 61 students tested a Brodhead scored at or higher than the standard, something never accomplished at any county school.

## Clayton Cash calls it quits

Rockcastle County head boys' basketball coach Clayton Cash delivered his letter of resignation to Superintendent Larry Hammond last Wednesday.  
Cash left his head coaching post after 13 years on the job and seven winning seasons.  
The move came as surprising to many around the basketball program. Most coaches retire at the conclusion of the winter basketball season or the school year.  
Superintendent Hammond commented on Cash's resignation this week. "The fact that Coach Cash resigned didn't necessarily come as unexpected. He paid his dues and put in a lot of hard work and time to the program. However, the timing of the decision did come as a shock. We have some very qualified individuals within the school system that Coach Cash's timing truly affected due to obligations they have already made for the upcoming year. However, I feel very confident that the council will recommend a quality person for the position," Hammond said.  
Cash said his retirement didn't

seem as abrupt to him as it might have others. "I thought it about all summer and finally realized that I couldn't give the time to the program that I had in the past. I didn't feel like it would be fair to kids or the school for me to continue coaching. Aaron (Cash's youngest son) will play college basketball this year and his schedule conflicts with the high school schedule. I truly want to spend more time with my family and watch Aaron play. After thirteen years, I am looking forward to relaxing and enjoying life," Cash told the Signal on Monday.  
Cash ended his tenure as head basketball coach at the Rock with a winning record of 185-174. However, his team's undoubtedly performed much more efficiently later on in his career. His first five years his team won at a percentage of 272 in posting a 34-91 record. His last five years on the job featured an impressive 105-44 record. Cash's first regional tournament appearance came in 1998. He took the Rockets to regional championships every year thereafter except for the 2001 season.  
Most recently, he took his team to four consecutive regional championships from 2002-2005 while claiming the 13th regional crown in both 2002 and 2004.

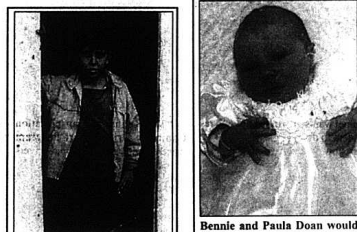

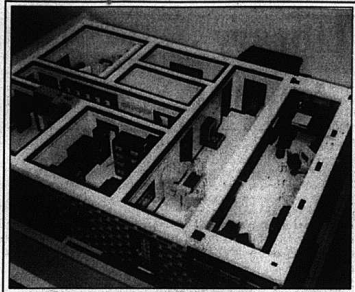

## School is back in session

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and the Drive Smart Program want to remind motorists to be alert now that students are heading back to school.

"With the new school year approaching, I am urging drivers to take all precautions to ensure safety for ourselves, the community and for our children. I am committed to increasing awareness to enhance safety on our roads. Please Drive Smart," said Acting Secretary Bill Nighibet.

In the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet District 8, which covers Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, Lincoln, McCreary, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Russell, and Wayne counties, there are approximately 82 schools. Motorists need to be aware of the thousands of students, school buses and parents traveling during their commute to and from school.

"Allow yourself enough time to get to school or to work. Leave earlier to avoid the potential 'to speed' to get to your destination on time."

"When entering a school zone, obey all of the signs. Know that the flashing yellow lights are there to remind you that you need to reduce your speed."

\*Pay extra attention at crosswalks. Take an extra look to be sure that no

students are crossing.

"Obey all signs, safety patrol and officers in your school zone. They are there to make the drop-offs and pick-ups run smoother."

"When you approach a school bus picking up a child, it is the law to stop. When the flashing lights come on and the red stop sign extends that means STOP. When you are on a 4 or five lane highway and you are approaching a bus that is coming to a stop to pick up a child, motorists that are in the same two lanes as the bus must stop. If you are a vehicle in the opposing lanes, you may continue. Motorists must take extra precautions at bus stops even after the bus completes its stop. Some children might run out into the roadway."

"Make sure that your child is in their safety seat or restrained properly when you are taking them to school."

"The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Drive Smart Program wants to educate and remind drivers of their responsibilities behind the wheel to ensure that everyone gets home to their families and that we have a safe 2005-2006 school year on our roadways," said Dan Barnett, Director of Driver Safety.

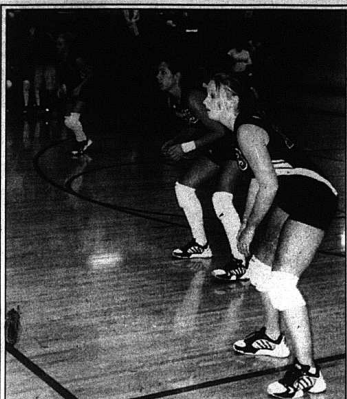

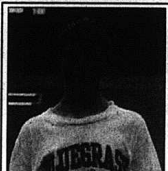

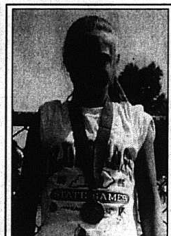

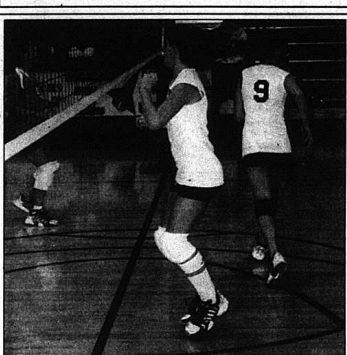

## Bittersweet Readers meet

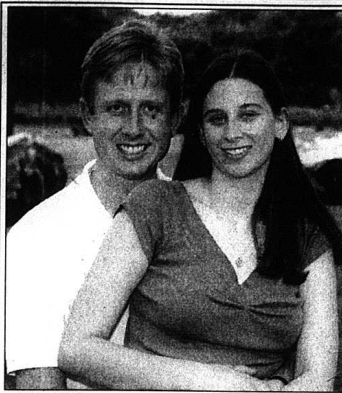

### NOTICE TO PARENTS, TEACHERS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE ROCKCASTLE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

On October 22, 1986, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA, Public Law 99-519) was signed into law. The law required EPA to develop regulations, which provide a comprehensive framework for addressing asbestos problems in public and private elementary and secondary schools. On October 30, 1987, EPA published the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule [40 CFR Part 763 Subpart E]. This Rule requires all public and private elementary and secondary schools to inspect for friable and non-friable asbestos, develop asbestos management plans that address asbestos hazards in school buildings, and implement response actions in a timely fashion.

To carry out the above activities involving inspections, management plans, and response actions the Rockcastle County Board of Education has utilized accredited personnel. On April 30, 1987, EPA published the Model Accredited Plan [40 CFR Part 763 Appendix C to Subpart E] required by AHERA, which specifies training, examination, and other requirements for persons who inspect, develop management plans and design or conduct response actions in schools. The Model Plan became effective on June 1, 1987.

In 1988, the Rockcastle County Board of Education retained Barry W. Cooper, Inc., who completed an initial inspection to locate all asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM) and developed and submitted to the State of Kentucky an asbestos Management Plan that includes the results of the inspections. In December of 1988, the Rockcastle County Board of Education began to implement this management plan. The facilities were once again inspected in Spring of 2005.

Copies of the management plan are always available for review for those interested persons at the Administration Office at 245 Richmond Road, Mt. Vernon, KY and at the Principal's Office at each School any time during normal office hours.

Copies are available for duplication at a cost of 25 cents for each 8-1/2x11 page of the Management Plan.
