Meth lab found

at Lake Linville

Four subjects were charged with manufacturing methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of marijuana. All four remain lodged in the Rockcastle County Detention Center.

Those arrested in October 2009 drug round-up "have not escaped justice"

Eddy Montgomery, Commonwealth Attorney for Rockcastle County, released an update on the Rockcastle Sheriff Department's drug roundup from October 2009.

That was when 21 individuals were arrested on drug charges relating to organized trafficking. Those involved were charged with buying prescription pills in Florida and bringing them to Kentucky where they were sold.

According to Assistant Commonwealth Attorney, Jeremy Bartley, who handled the prosecutions, and the Rockcastle Sheriff's Department, conducted a lengthy narcotics investigation that lasted for over a year.

The investigation, handled by Deputies Barry Adams and Jason Kirby, centered on the influx of prescription pills, originating in Florida pain clinics and ending up in Rockcastle County. Those charged were charged with selling pills ranging from Percocet to Xanax.

In October 2009, the Sheriff's Department was issued District Court arrest warrants on 21 individuals. Subsequently, many of those cases were dismissed in District Court and referred to the Rockcastle grand jury.

According to Bartley, currently 20 of the 21 individuals have had their cases presented to the grand jury and indictments were returned in all the cases. Further, all 20 of those indicted have pled guilty.

"I know there was some concern early on when these cases were dismissed in District Court," remarked Bartley. "However, only the Circuit Court can resolve felony cases so this was merely a procedural matter. These individuals did not escape justice. Sometimes, with overloaded crime labs and overworked law enforcement, these things take some time to be done correctly."

City property to be used for skateboard park

The City of Mt. Vernon committed to allowing a portion of city property to be used for a skateboard park on Monday night.

The property, located directly below the courthouse on East Main Street and across from Napa Auto Parts, can be used as soon as the portable equipment for the park is made available

The project was initiated by the 2010 class of Leadership Rockcastle. RCMS teacher Robert Phillips and Citizens Bank employee Kathy Burgin were there on behalf of the group to submit the proposal to the council.

Phillips told the council that, as a teacher, he sees kids every day who "just need a place to go. These students don't play the traditional sports, but that doesn't mean they shouldn't have a facility available to them," Phillips said.

Councilwoman Sharon Saylor made a motion to approve the request, while Shelly Raines Lewis seconded the motion. The council then voted unanimously to allow for access. Mayor Cromer said he

thought this would be a temporary location, and that he has other property in mind.

"However, it is important at this point that we give our young people a safe place to perform their hobby," Cromer said.

He went on to say that "skateboarders are now using restricted areas such as church parking lots, and there is no reason the city shouldn't step up and provide a safer environment."

New Renfro Valley CEO Vickie Kidd was also in attendance at the meeting. She wanted not only to introduce herself to the

Bartley has been very satisified to this point regarding the sentences that have been handed down. So far, in cases handled by Judge Jeffrey T. Burdette and Judge David A. Tapp, those sentenced have received a total of over 426 months imprisonment.

Montgomery noted the successful resolution of all the cases thus far. "The pill pipeline from Florida to Rockcastle County is a top priority of my office. We hope that this sends a message that the illegal sale of prescription pills will not be a profitable trade in this county."

Five more Rockcastle **Countians** convicted on drug charges

Five of those responsible for contributing to the problem Rockcastle County were convicted in Rockcastle Circuit Court last week.

Assistant Commonwealth Attorney Jeremy Bartley prosecuted each of the cases that came before Judge Jeffrey T. Burdette.

Troy Bullock, 31, of Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to Second Degree Trafficking. The Commonwealth has recom-mmended a sentence of 18 months. Sentencing has been set for October.

Ottie Kirby, 48, of Brodhead, was sentenced on Second Degree Trafficking charges to one year imprisonment.

Lisa Mason, 38, of Brodhead, was sentenced on Theft of Controlled Substances charges. She received 18 months in

Casper Hurley, 37, of McKee, pled guilty to Burglary, Third Degree charges. The Commonwealth has recommended two years imprisonment.



Wilson, which was presented to the Rockcastle County DAR on November 21, 1980. It notes several Revolutionary patriots, thirtynine in total, who settled in Rockcastle County between 1803 and 1830.


In my research, I ran across a Richard Allen, thinking he might possibly be some relation on Stanley's maternal side. His daughter, Drucilla Parker applied for his pension March 29, 1850, but according to the census of 1850, there were no Allens in the county at that time, according to Jess Wilson's research.

Captain James Dysart was born in Donnegal, Ireland, in 1744. At age 18, he was given enough money for his passage to America by his grandfather. He became a frontiersman, and later built a mill and distillery. In his old age, he came to Kentucky, and was noted as "one of the most unusual men Rockcastle has known". At one time, he was considered the most important man in the county. He had an extensive library, and he had settled in the Skaggs Creek community. He was the first high-ranking officer to settle in Rockcastle County.

Moses Farris was active in Indian affairs, and fought many battles with the Indians along the early trade routes to Kentucky before it became a commonwealth.

Nicholas Houk was the oldest patriot to survive in the county, where he died in 1840 at the age of 100. He had come to Rockcastle County January 23, 1819. He settled in what was known as "the old Houk place", and more recently known as the Oliver Dowell place. His grandson later built and operated the first horse-powered mill in

Rockcastle County. That will conclude this week's research regarding the Revolutionary War. A continuation will follow next

August is National Immunization Awareness Month

Are Immunizations Dangerous?

Presented by Dr. Callie Shaffer

In recent years, there has been a clamor over the occasional complications of immunizations. Paralytic polio has occurred in some children or their family members and

pertussis shots have been blamed for brain damage. If rubella is given during pregnancy, it can potentially harm the baby. Unfortunately, virtually everything carries some risks, even something as safe as "baby shots."

When parents hear of these complications reported by the media, it is easy to become alarmed. Unfortunately, today's parents are too young

to remember when these diseases actually occurred, such as the polio epidemics of the 1950's or the measles epidemics which lasted into the 1960's.

The vaccines have been so effective, that most of today's doctors have never seen acute cases of polio, diphtheria, or measles, much less small pox or lock jaw.

The risk of complications from immunizations is about 1-3 per million doses, so we can not ignore that there is some risk every time a person gets an immunization. Drug companies are developing less reactive vaccines, but there may always be some risk.

The countries, such as Great Britain, Finland and Japan, which have become lax with immunizations because of fear of these risks have all had outbreaks of these illnesses causing much greater harm than the side effects of the shots.

Finally, we must put the risk of immunizations into perspective. In comparison to the rare complications from shots, about 1000 young children die and many more are seriously injured each year in house fires caused by cigarettes. Having a parent who smokes is a much greater risk to a child than immunizations.

They say other neighbors have been feeding her and suggest she needs a permanent home away from the busy roadways, where she's likely to be hit sooner or later.

The other long story out of Eubank, impossible to make short, involves the life and times of Ed Buis.

I think we took a likin' to each other right away.

Perhaps it had something to do with the fact I had served as editor of his hometown newspaper, The Casey County News, in the mid to late 70s.

He has been a regular reader of the Casey News and the Commonwealth-Journal (where I got my start in journalism in 1970) for decades, according to his son, Doug.

His tales of providing customers with appliances when electricity was first made available to the rural areas serve to remind me of the mid-1950s when I would accompany my dad on deliveries for the W. D. Gover Furniture Company in Somerset.

I've never forgotten being at one very rural residence where my dad asked the lady of the house the time of day.

She told her son to "go outside and look" and I could see him squinting as he stared up at the bright sun.

"Looks like about 12:30, momma," said the boy, thus introducing me to what my dad later explained was "sun time."

Despite being a handsome gentleman, Ed was on "slow

time" in the matrimony department, remaining a bachelor until 1956 when he caught the eye of a pretty young widow working at First State Bank.

He points out that the marriage has survived despite the time his young bride, the former Helen Joyce Barron, fell for another man.

With a twinkle in his eye, he explains how customers were invited to the store to watch shows when color televisions were first introduced.

A favorite was Bonanza, featuring the Cartwright boys, Little Joe, Hoss, and

Food for thought: Packing healthy lunches


- Make sure you balance the meal so that it contains protein, fruit and/or vegetables, some carbohydrate, and fat.

Because she knew almost all of the teenagers on my list. Mommie Katie allowed me to have the party without any chaperones there in the house. However, she, Pop, and Bee were at my house, which wasn't all that far from the site of the party. I am sure they spent a lot of time on the porch making sure that the noise level was to their satisfaction. At any rate, they did not have to come to the party to correct any disturbing behavior.

Mommie Katie had filled the kitchen table with far more food than I had ever seen on that table. We had ham sandwiches, pimento cheese sandwiches, bowls filled with chips, every kind of pickles known to mankind, a variety of cookies and brownies, cupcakes, a huge bowl of cut-up vegetables, and a variety of soft drinks. It resulted in a steady stream of teenagers making their way into the kitchen area. No one left the party hungry, that's for sure.

My stereo was set up in the living room and lots of us were dancing there and in the den. The volume of that rockand-roll was loud enough to be heard throughout the entire house. I can remember Bud Cox giving "jitterbug" lessons in the den. I also remember Paul Daily sitting in a swing on the front porch with a girl, but I have no idea which one she was. Several of the girls remained in the kitchen assisting people with food and drinks.

As the night wore on and the lights were dimmed, I have no doubt that someone suggested playing Post Office and that we did so. Is there anyone from that generation who didn't play Post Office at one time or another? I must say that I have never known of meeting one.

Not long after and to my utter surprise, several cars slowly began to fill Pop's driveway bringing new guests. I guess word had gotten around, turning my origi-

nal list into more like 25 or 30 teenagers. Of course, I was thrilled that so many of my friends were coming to my party. Several of them brought their 45 RPM records along to add to the tunes that were available for dancing.

The jitterbug began to give way to slower dances as we listened to Chances Are and The Twelfth of Never by Johnny Mathis and Only You and The Great Pretender by the Platters. The later it became, the more slow songs were played. Some of the couples moved to the porch to sit together in swings and lounge chairs. I can remember the porch light being turned off. The mood of the entire party was mellowing. Dancing closer and closer, couples began pairing off. Then of course we guys were trying to find the right "sweet nothings" to whisper to our girls.

Eventually the time came when the girls with the earlier curfews had to get home, and the party began to wind down. Some of the guys were providing a lot of the transportation home. Several of the girls were in the kitchen cleaning up the mess we had created. When I told them that I would take care of it myself, they suggested that Mommie Katie might let us do this again if we cleaned up the kitchen - so I allowed them to assist me. By the time the kitchen was presentable, I walked into the den area only to be surprised that it too had been straightened up. By midnight I called Mommie Katie and told her that all of the guests were now gone, and she returned down the path to her house.

I was thrilled to hear her say, "David Joe. the house looks so good, you can do this again sometime soon." That was exactly what I wanted to hear. Our parties were just good old clean fun with lots of rock-and-roll and great food. And my first boy-girl party had been a total success.



council, but to also clear up any misunderstandings that might have arisen from last month's meeting regarding Renfro Valley advertising.

"Renfro Valley wants to be a part of this community and want this community to be a part of us. Hopefully this commitment was displayed in our gesture to offer half off tickets to local citizens," Kidd said.

"However, we fully realize that it is our responsibility to market our venue, and we never had any intentions of asking the city to fund a campaign on our behalf. But, we do ask that when tax dollars are used to market our tourist attractions we be included," Kidd said.

She closed by saying, "we also pay city and county taxes already and do not want any more taxes levied on us."

Kidd's last statement was in reference to Mayor Cromer's proposal at last month's meeting to place a ticket sales tax on Renfro Valley. His suggestion was in a response to the perceived request from the Tourist Commission that restaurant tax dollars be used for a television advertising campaign to market Renfro Valley.

However, it was acknowledged by the council that no proposal for the city to contribute to an advertising campaign exists at this point.

The last item on the agenda was in reference to the ongoing Rose Hill Road sewer project. Cromer said that he would soon ask for authorization to condemn the Girt property for a temporary construction easement. The city has apparently attempted to make contact three times with the property owner and have not received a response.

The Mayor will ask for authorization from the council as soon as the results of an August 9th appraisal are final.





Third grade students at Round stone Elementary were thrilled when they learned that the reigns were being handed down to them in caring for the greenhouse here at RES. "I was really excited because I have a garden of my own and my mommy says I have a green thumb" says Tatum Isaacs when first learning of the class involvement in the greenhouse.

During the 2008-2009 school year Ms. Melissa Fairchild wrote a grant and was awarded money from PRIDE to build a small greenhouse. Last school year RES was able to build onto the greenhouse and purchase garden boxes, composters, and a few materials. During the 2010-2011 school year RES is expecting to receive additional grant money from PRIDE to purchase more garden boxes, a tool shed, and other greenhouse materials.

The greenhouse program here at RES provides a handson experience that the students love and will not forget. Students are able to learn

about the life cycle and stages of plants by helping to make them grow. When Ravyn Bullens was asked what she thought about working in the greenhouse she replied, "It will be pretty fun and I will get to work with plants and learn about them." This hands-on approach to learning gives students a deeper understanding of plant science.

Green is first from Rockcastle to attend Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science at WKU

Caroline Green, a student at Rockcastle County High School, is one of 61 students selected to complete her junior and senior years of high school at the Carol Martin Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science at Western Kentucky University.

The students in this year's class span 38 counties from across the Commonwealth. This gifted group of rising high school juniors brings with them to the Gatton Academy an average ACT score almost 10 points higher than the statewide average for graduating seniors.

Last fall, 275 students began the admissions process with 125 students qualifying for review. Students were reviewed based on ACT/SAT scores, high school grades, awards, extracurricular activities, responses to essay questions, and letters of recommendation. Earlier this month, 85 candidates were invited for interviews with Academy staff members and representatives from across



Kentucky. In the end, 61 dynamic applicants emerged from the review process.

The selected students scored an average composite of 29.2 on the ACT and 29.5 on the math portion of the exam. The highest possible score is 36. The 2009 state average ACT score for graduating Kentucky high school seniors was a composite of 19.4.

"As we begin planning for our fourth year at the Gatton Academy, I am amazed and honored to work with such outstanding students," Gott said. "The incoming Class of 2012 once again demonstrates the incredible caliber of students from across the Commonwealth. The depth of academic strength and emerging leadership among this group reveals that the state is making a major contribution toward meeting the demand for more professionals in the STEM(science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) fields.'

This year, eight counties had students admitted to the Gatton Academy for the first time: Breathitt, Carroll, Clay, Clinton, Montgomery, Rockcastle, Russell and Todd. To date, the Gatton Academy has admitted students from 95 of Kentucky's 120 counties.

The goals of the Gatton Academy are to enable Kentucky's exceptional young scientists and mathematicians to learn in an environment which offers advanced educational opportunities, preparing them for leadership roles in Kentucky. Moreover, the Gatton Academy assists in preparing Kentucky to compete in a knowledge-based economy by increasing the number of scientists and engineers who live and work in the state.

Students will finish their junior and senior years of high school living in Schneider Hall and taking courses offered by WKU. At the end of their two-year course of study, they will graduate from high school and have earned at least 60 college credit hours. While at Gatton, students' test scores, and any rewards or recognitions they receive, will be credited to their home high school.

The Academy provides a rich living/learning environment designed specifically for academically talented adolescent students that features clubs, organizations and community service. Additionally students are able to participate in advanced research with WKU faculty members. Research conducted during students' time at the Gatton Academy has been honored in the nationally competitive Siemens Competition, Intel Science Talent Search, Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Program, and the Department of Defense Science, Math, and Research for Transformation (SMART) Scholarship Pro-

The Gatton Academy is Kentucky's only state-supported, residential program for high school students with interests in advanced science and math careers and one of only sixteen such programs in the nation. In 2009, Newsweek magazine honored the Academy as one of 16 "Public Elite" American high schools.

Caroline has chosen psychology and computer technology as her two areas of research emphasis. The journey toward acceptance to the Gatton Academy required many hours of study and preparation. Caroline is grateful for all the help and encouragement that she received along the way from teachers and administrators in Rockcastle County. She sends special thanks to the following teachers: Mrs. Angela Baker, Mr. Scott Adams, and especially Mrs. Vanessa Bullock, who first introduced her to the Center for Gifted Studies at WKU.

Caroline's family includes her brother Ira, her parents Christie Green and Darrell Hager of Roundstone, her grandparents Janice and David Hager of Roundstone, her grandmother Sharon Sinclair of Ashland, Kentucky, and her grandparents Betty and Tom Green of Riceville, Tennessee.

Conservation Reserve Program sign-up runs through Aug. 27th

A general sign-up for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) continues through Aug. 27. During the sign-up period, which opened on Aug. 2, farmers may offer eligible land for CRP's competitive general sign-up at their county Farm Service Agency (FSA) of-

CRP is a voluntary program that assists farmers to use environmentally sensitive land for conservation benefits. Producers enrolling in CRP plant long-term, resource-conserving covers in exchange for rental payments, cost-share, and technical assistance.

CRP removes land from agricultural production by entering into long-term contracts for 10 to 15 years. In

exchange, participants receive annual rental payments and a payment of up to 50 percent of the cost of establishing conservation practices.

Land currently not enrolled in CRP may be offered in this sign-up provided all eligibility requirements are met.

Contracts awarded under this sign-up are scheduled to become effective Oct. 1.

FSA will evaluate and rank eligible CRP offers using an Environmental Benefits Index (EBI) for environmental benefits to be gained from enrolling the land in CRP. The EBI consists of five environmental factors (wildlife, water, soil, air and enduring benefits) and cost. Decisions on the

EBI cutoff will be made after the sign-up ends and after analyzing the EBI data of all the offers.

In addition to the general sign-up, CRP's continuous sign-up program is ongoing. Continuous acres represent the most environmentally desirable and sensitive land.
