## Janet Wells named State Coordinator for Kentucky Bluegrass Award Program

Janet Wells, Librarian at Rockcastle County High School, was recently appointed the State Coordinator of the Kentucky Bluegrass Award Program, the statewide children's choice awards program for authors and books. Kentucky Association of School Librarians

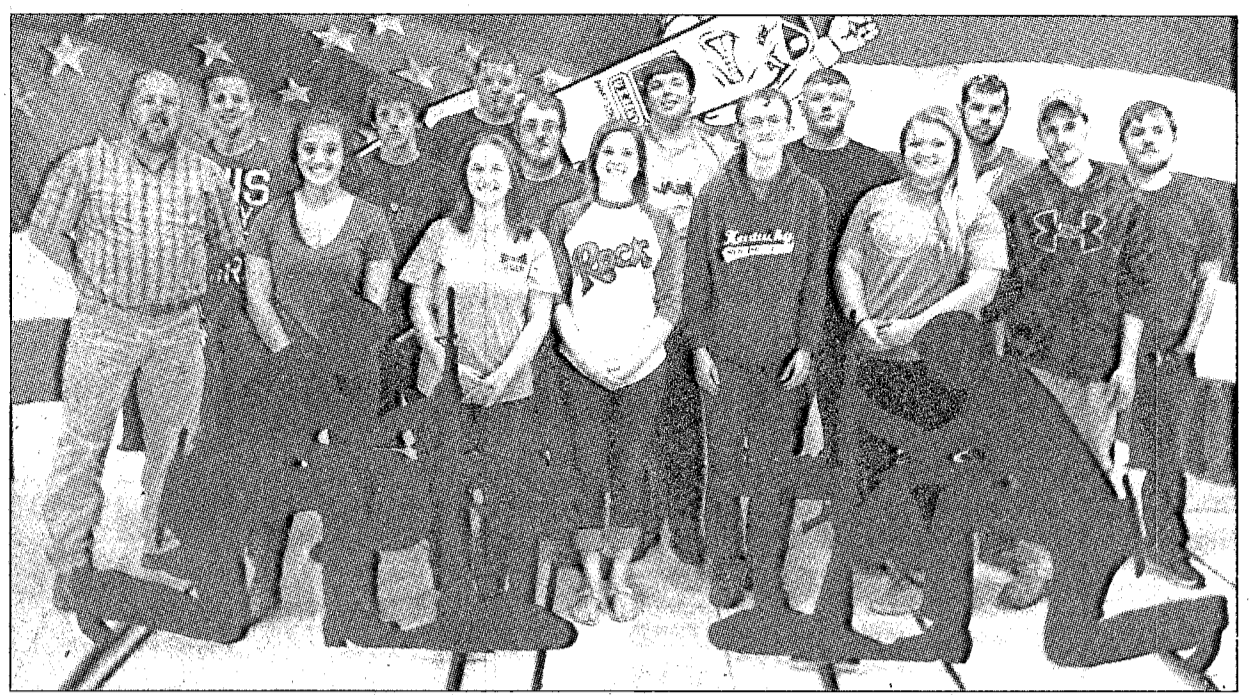

(KASL) President James Allen made the appointment at KASL's March board meeting in Louisville.

Wells succeeds Dr. Jennifer Smith of Northern Kentucky University, who created and oversaw the KBA Program for 33 years. The original KBA award was presented in 1983 to author Chris Van Allsburg for *Jumanji*. In 1988, KBA was divided into two divisions, K-3 and 4-8. By 2001, the KBA program included K-2, 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12 grade divisions. A fifth division for Preschool students is in the process of being added to address all of Kentucky's young readers. As a student choice program, only young people

## Circuit Clerks celebrate surpassing national goal of registered donors

For more than a decade, the month of April has been about saving and healing lives. Donate Life champions across the country fill

the month of April with power testimonials to demonstrate the lifesaving message of donation and transplantation. The goal of Na-

tional Donate Life Month is to make life possible by educating and motivating individuals to register their decision to be organ, eye

and tissue donors.

One of those champions is Rockcastle County Circuit Clerk Eliza Jane York. "This April is especially momentous because Kentucky has a very exciting announcement to make. I am honored to share that Kentucky has surpassed the national goal. Today, 50% of Kentuckians are registered donors! This is a point of pride for our Commonwealth and a symbol of hope for all those waiting for lifesaving transplants."

Since 2007, the Circuit Court Clerks and their deputies have asked every Kentuckian getting a driver's license or ID to join the Kentucky Organ Donor Registry. "It's a question we are required to ask, but knowing what a difference it makes to families, gives this question even greater meaning. Joining the confidential registry is stating your willingness to save lives, if you can. Every person who says 'yes' gives hope and shows support for patients in need," York said.

The national artwork for 2016 National Donate Life Month is inspired by sunflowers, which is especially meaningful to one passionate Kentucky family. "Carissa was a beautiful young woman with a heart of gold. She was full of energy, a hard worker, loved to make people smile and could never do enough to help others," said Carissa's mom, Cathy Mattingly.

In 2009, Carissa and her

two children, Rance and Adie, died in a horrible automobile accident. In the worst moments of her life, Cathy recalled a conversation with Carissa. "She said to me, 'Mom, if you have something in this house, you don't need, you give it to Goodwill. Why wouldn't you give your organs to those who need it?' I knew that she wanted to save others." Carissa saved three lives that night. Cathy has met her daughter's kidney recipient, Matt. Matt travels the world and sends Cathy postcards showing where Carissa's gift has taken him. Cathy has listened to her daughter's heartbeat again thanks to her heart recipient,

Elezerine. Cathy says, "Elezerine is a firecracker, just like Carissa was and just love her."

Cathy's family has grown sunflowers in their garden in Meade County for years. A favorite of Carissa, Rance and Adie's, Cathy loved that sunflowers were picked as this year's Donate Life Month artwork. The face of a sunflower contains as many as 2,000 seeds. One sunflower has the potential to create an entirely new field of flowers. Everyone has similar potential - to make life possible for many by registering as a donor. One organ donor can save the life of up to eight people,

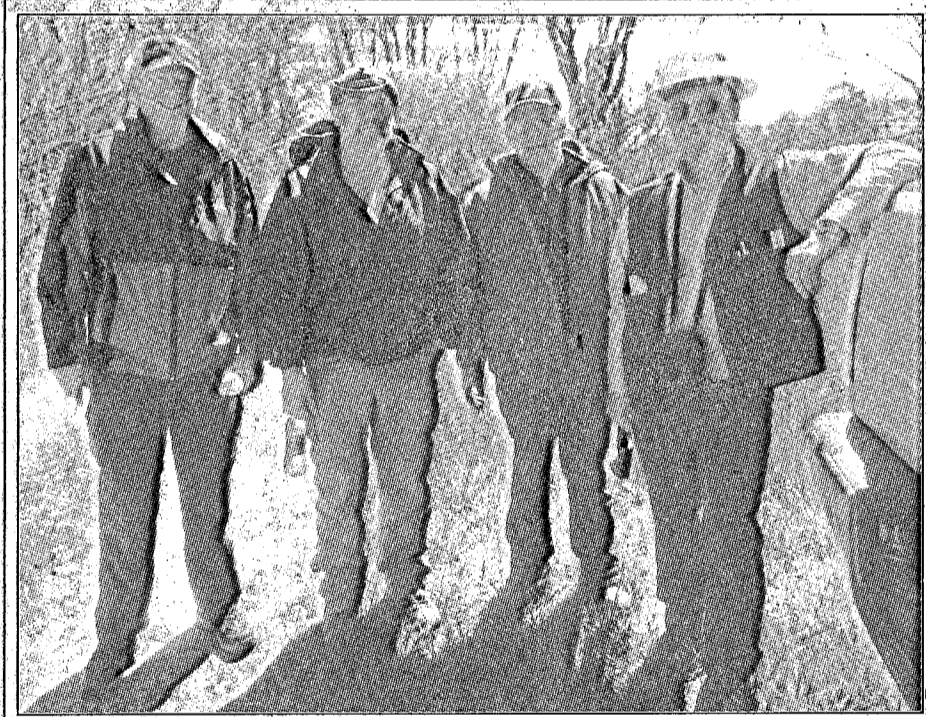
April 10. He and Givan Fox had hiked the Trace from Kingsport, TN over 16 days in March 2015.

Penix's fifth-great grandfather, Joshua Penix, came with Daniel Boone along Boone Trace in 1779 and it has been Penix's wish to

continue to walk in the steps of his great grandfather.

## Rockcastle County celebrates Adult College Readiness Month

Kentucky Governor Matt Bevin has designated April 2016 as Kentucky Adult College Readiness Month. The designation of this month corresponds with the official April 1, 2016, launch of a partnership between Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA) and Kentucky Adult Education (KYAE), a unit of the Council on Postsecondary Education.

Locally, Rockcastle County Adult Education is promoting adult college readiness and its partnership with KHEAA throughout the month of April 2016.

Rockcastle County Judge Executive Doug Bishop proclaimed the month of April Rockcastle County Adult College Readiness Month during a

signing ceremony on March 30th, 2016.

"By 2020, 63% of all jobs in Kentucky will require some level of postsecondary education, so it's important for our residents to consider taking that next educational step," says Jenny Sweet, Program Director Rockcastle County Adult Education. "Our program offers free instructional services to help adults prepare academically, along with free services that help adults do things like apply for financial aid. Together with our partners, we can help adults successfully transition or return to college or technical training."

To celebrate the recognition of April as Rockcastle County Adult College Readiness Month, Rockcastle County Adult Educa-

tion will host a visit a College and Career Fair on Thursday, April 14th 10:00-2:00 at the Rockcastle Adult Education Center, located at 955 West Main Street next to the middle school.

Rockcastle County Adult Education offers free classes to help qualified individuals build their skills to earn a GED diploma, Kentucky Essential Skills Certificate or National Career Readiness Certificate and/or prepare for postsecondary training, college and career. KHEAA's mission is to expand educational opportunities by providing financial and informational resources that enable Kentuckians to attain their higher educational goals.

may vote for their choice of the top book from a Master List of ten books presented annually for their grade level. Students can participate in public and private schools as well as local public libraries and bookstores. Each book has been chosen by a committee of readers who look for quality literature to appeal to a wide variety of readers.

Wells' responsibilities include overseeing the five grade level committees, working with the five grade level chairpersons to fill va-

cancies on the committees, compiling the Master Lists, filing board reports with KASL, and working with book publishers regarding book choices. She will also work with KASL's webmaster to promote the KBA program and assist with the voting process each April, as well as working with the KASL Local Arrangements Chair who will invite one of the winning authors to be a luncheon speaker at the Kentucky Library Association/Kentucky Association of School Librarians Joint Fall

Conference each September. Additionally, she will present programs at various library and reading conferences to introduce the KBA Program to teachers, librarians, and literacy professionals.

The 2015-2016 winners have just been announced. A record-setting 59,401 votes were cast this year. New Master Lists are posted in early April each year at [www.kasl.us](http://www.kasl.us) and voting opens the following mid-March with a final voting deadline on April 1st of each year.

Wells' participation in the KBA Program began in 2002 when she promoted the 9-12 list with her students at the Rockcastle County High School Library as a fun reading incentive. By 2006, she had joined the High School Selection Committee and began presenting sessions at library conferences to introduce the High School Master List to librarians. Mem-

bers on the selection committee read an average of 27.6 books of the 61 young adult titles considered for the 2016-2017 Master List and meet four times per year to discuss the books being considered. For the past two years, Wells has sponsored a KBA Book Club at RCHS, which allows students to read current KBA nominees as well as having a sneak peek at potential

titles for the next list. Wells is completing her 31st year in education at Rockcastle County High School, serving the past 21 years as Librarian.

give sight to two people through cornea donation and heal countless others through tissue donation.

Since 1992, The Rockcastle Circuit Clerk's office has worked for this mission by collecting \$1 for the Trust for Life's educational initiatives.

The number of people in need of transplants continues to outpace the number of organs donated. More than 121,000 people are waiting for a transplant and second chance at life. On average, 22 people die each day because the organ they need is not donated in time.

Regardless of age or medical history, everyone can register to be a hero, like even Carissa, when they renew their driver's license or ID.

"Carissa was a hero. Every 'yes' is an heroic step towards saving those in need. Thank you Rockcastle County for your generosity," says York.

where daily blogs will be posted and a schedule of his camp sites will be available. A map with a GPS locator showing his position in real time as the hike progresses

will also be available to view on the website.

Boone Trace was opened by Daniel Boone and his trailblazing party during March and April 1775 and was the first road, EVER,

into the land that was to become Kentucky.

It is of enormous historical significance to the founding of Kentucky, but also the opening of the entire west. It is also frequently confused with the Wilderness Road which evolved out of Boone Trace later in 1796.

Penix is a member of the Friends of Boone Trace, Inc. whose mission is to support the hike and save the remnants of Boone Trace while elevating awareness of its historical importance.

Avid hikers that would be interested in preserving a part of history are invited to join the Keepers of Boone Trace.
